Minutes from meeting dated 3-31-2025

Denny Briggs called the meeting to order at 7:01pm with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call:

Present: Denny Briggs, Ray Krieger, Cori Wilber, Matt Stahlin, Nate Wolff

Absent: Nancy Solomon

Note: 1 current vacancy

There were approximately 8 members of the community present along with Zoning Administrator Jeanne Vandersloot.

Changes to the agenda:

Wilber made a motion to accept the agenda. Stahlin seconded. All approved. Motion carried.

Approval of last meeting minutes:

Stahlin made a motion to accept the minutes from the 3-25-2025 meeting. Krieger seconded. All approved. Motion carried.

Report from Zoning Administrator:

Report was given at another PC meeting earlier this month.

Public Comment:

Polly Wolff asked Chairman Briggs if he had checked into whether a resident can communicate with a Board member outside of a public meeting. He indicated that it is allowed, and that Board members should understand and know what the OMA regulations are.

Old Business:

- Battery Storage Facility Ordinance.
 - Resumed working on the BESS ordinance draft.
 - Wilber had researched the lifecycle of battery storage facilities. She relayed that the lithiumion batteries that are typically used in battery storage facilities have an estimated lifespan of 10-15 years, though that is highly dependent on use. No data could be found on the lifecycle of facilities themselves.

- Reviewed the 4 suggested districts that Vandersloot had proposed. Three of them were in AG-RES, one in AG district. Reviewed locations of homes and transmission lines in relation to the suggested districts.
- o General discussion about what uses the government can invoke eminent domain for.
- Setbacks to non-participating properties shall be 300 feet from the property line. Removed the "to a dwelling" setback. Reviewed how far from the road right of way a BESS could be if setback was 50 feet. Wilber expressed concerned that the 88-foot setback in that instance could allow a BESS to be closer than 300 feet to a residence if the home was across the road. The PC decided on 150 ft as the road right of way setback.
- Briggs suggested an acreage cap on BESSs. All agreed. Cap was set to 5 acres, not including the setback areas.
- Majority consensus was to designate Overlay District 3 as the allowed district for BESSs.
- Wilber made a motion to schedule a public hearing for the Battery Energy Storage System ordinance. Stahlin seconded. All approved.
- Stahlin made a motion to move the previously scheduled May 12th meeting to May 5, and to include the public hearing as part of that meeting. Wolff seconded. All approved. Motion carried.
